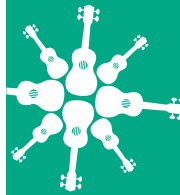

A Message from the Executive Director



Greetings from South Shore Arts here in the waning days of summer. And a very active summer it has been! First, we've been hard at work to increase the vibrancy and visual impact of each issue of *Convergence* to more effectively highlight the artistic endeavors

that South Shore Arts undertakes—both in sharing what we have delivered over the last quarter as well as what we have planned in the coming months. In both cases, our intent is to share information and engage our audience to connect, participate, and help us celebrate the art in our communities that adds to the vibrancy of life in the region. Please check out the content within as well as the new “full-color” look of the current issue and let us know what you think and what more you would like to see!

Second, from a programming perspective, this summer has been a “knock-out”! Our expanded weekly Summer Art Camps proved to be huge hits with our 6–12-year-old artists. Additionally, we partnered with the local Crossroads YMCAs from six different communities and delivered to their summer campers our “Magic Trash” program. This program is based on the picture book biography and artwork by Detroit-based artist Tyree Guyton, his Heidelberg Project, with themes that art can transform communities, that everyday recycled items can become “magic trash,” and that one person can truly make an impact. These engaged young people who, inspired by his messages, created a diverse set of artistic masterpieces each time they visited. And for our youngest artists, our drop-in “Art & Story Hour” proved to be a very popular “Parent and Me” program every week. In total, our art camps, classes, workshops, and outreach programs provided over 600 artists of all ages with a variety of creative activities and outlets to enjoy this summer.

For those who didn't have a calling to create art, South Shore Arts provided a different calling with our family friendly *Animal House* summer exhibit curated by our partners, Linda Dorman and Tom Torluemke. This exhibit was designed to highlight the engagement of animals in art from the earliest evidence of art history and celebrate the important relationship that animals have with

people and the environment around them. From the pet portraits displayed, our “Cat Wall,” our natural environments, and the three-dimensional, life-sized, extinct Northern White Rhinoceros created by artist Victoria Fuller, touring this exhibit was like being on your own personal safari. We complimented this popular exhibit with additional displays in our Atrium Gallery and made many of these works of art and other unique items available for purchase in our Gallery Gift Shop. Visitors and members can always find something new in our galleries and gift shop at South Shore Arts.

Finally, if visual arts weren't in your wheelhouse this summer, we hope you had a chance to catch one of the Northwest Indiana Symphony Orchestra's Summer Music Festival performances offered for free in beautiful outdoor settings in seven different local communities located throughout the Region in late July and early August. These were just quintessential ways to spend an enjoyable summer evening with family, friends and neighbors, listening to terrific music presented by our very talented Maestro Kirk Muspratt and Symphony musicians. Just a taste of what's to come in our fantastic upcoming 82nd Symphony Season which kicks off with a Gala celebration on October 6 and our scary opening concert, “Frightfully Fun Halloween,” on Thursday October 26! Designed to be a fun evening of spooky music (and yes, costumes are encouraged)! Tickets are on sale now.

I highlight these offerings to demonstrate all the ways South Shore Arts, along with the affiliated Northwest Indiana Symphony, provide a multitude of opportunities for individuals and families to participate and enjoy the arts throughout our communities. And while summer was loaded with these creative opportunities, we are even more excited about what lies ahead this fall. In fact, this will be the 80th anniversary of the annual South Shore Arts Salon Show—our juried exhibition that celebrates original art from local artists in Northwest Indiana and the Chicago area. Please read more about this and all the articles that follow to learn more about the new people and programs that will come to life at South Shore Arts this fall and beyond. And learn about our Annual and Lifetime Memberships to get the greatest value in your visits. The arts make life better in our communities! Come on out and enjoy!

SALON SHOW

Marks 80th Anniversary!

With the avowed purpose “to stimulate interest and appreciation of art in our region,” ten artists formed the Hammond District Art Association in 1936. Membership was limited to Hammond and Calumet City artists. Together, they sponsored the first annual Art Exhibition of the Hammond District Art Association in the millinery department of the Edward C. Minas Company Department Store in Hammond. The ten founding artists were William J. Bachman (architect of the Center for Visual & Performing Arts), Martha Ellyson, Anne Geyer, O.O. Haag, Lenore Conde Lawson, Eunice McCullough, Frank Myslive, Clyde Price, Laverne Thornton, and H. Tom Tuinman.

In addition to Edward C. and Clarence Minas who furnished free space, prizes and other support, substantial credit goes to Mr. Haag, who, along with his wife Margaret, assembled and catalogued the exhibits for many years, furnishing housing for the judges and the labor necessary for the receipt and return of artwork.

As recalled by Theresa Buzinski, an art patron from East Chicago, the *Salon Show* was the exhibit where one could go to view and buy original art created by some of the area’s finest artists. Mrs. Buzinski paid \$30 for the piece accompanying this article, which she remembers purchasing when the exhibit was still held in the Minas hat department. The artist was B. Morris and the piece looks as pristine now as it did the year she purchased it. This annual exhibition would continue to grow, as the group welcomed artists outside of Hammond, until it would officially become known as the *Salon Show* in 1943, forming the cornerstone of the organization that would come to be known as South Shore Arts.

From its humble yet ambitious roots on State Street in downtown Hammond, the annual *Salon Show* would continue to push against any of its perceived boundaries growing to need ever larger spaces to accommodate the expanding interests of residents interested in the arts. Over the years the *Salon Show* has been juried by a roster of exceptional artists and art connoisseurs alike, such as Sergio Gomez, Tom Torluemke, Lanny Silverman and David Klamen, to name but a few.

South Shore Arts is excited to continue this tradition with the *80th annual Salon Show*, September 8 through November 4, 2023, with an awards ceremony held on Sunday, October, 15, from 1–3pm. With up to \$13,000 in cash prizes to be awarded, this year is shaping up to be the largest in South Shore Arts’ long history, leaving one to ponder how those original ten founders would view today’s 80th edition compared to the show’s humble beginnings so many years ago. In 2022, a new top prize of \$2,500 was established by the family Tracy & Marc Schwimmer in memory of Mrs. Schwimmer’s parents, Renee & Sam Denmark, long-time supporters of Northern Indiana Arts Association, later South Shore Arts.

This year’s juror will be Ish Muhammad, a self-taught artist, curator, and teacher, born in New York City, who is no stranger to South Shore Arts, where he has been affiliated for nearly 30 years. Calling Indiana home for more than three decades, Muhammad received his BS in Electrical Engineering at Purdue University. His work is post-graffiti abstract expressionism and has been exhibited nationally and internationally in galleries, museums, and at site-specific installations, including the Indiana State Museum, Indianapolis Museum of Contemporary Art, Chicago Cultural Center, Zhou B Art Center, Swope Art Museum, and Maison de Metallos in Paris, France. As a Curator, Muhammad exercises his network of talented friends and peers to present a uniquely composed iteration of individual works in harmony with the space and each other. We are excited to see Ish’s perspective and selections for this year’s milestone South Shore Arts’ *80th Annual Salon Show!*

Tri-County 49TH ANNUAL Jr./Sr High School Exhibition

April 14 – May 14, 2023

The Tri-County Junior/Senior High School Art Exhibit, always a perennial favorite, is a time for students, family members, friends and teachers to crowd into the gallery in celebration of students' artistry and achievement. South Shore Arts presented the show's 49th edition, showcasing students in grades six through twelve, from schools in Lake, Porter and LaPorte counties in Indiana and south suburban Cook County in Illinois, April 14 through May 14, with an awards ceremony held on Sunday, May 7. The exhibit drew 23 high schools and six middle schools that filled the gallery with over 800 individual pieces of art, making it the largest show in several years.

Over \$8,000 in prizes and scholarships was awarded, including the \$2,000 Berwanger Scholarship, the \$1,000 Leslie Denmark Memorial Award, donated by Tracy & Marc Schwimmer, and a first-time \$6,550 scholarship to attend a summer camp intensive at the famous Interlochen Center for the Arts in Michigan! We thank the many donors who have been sponsoring awards for years, as well as those who gave this year for the very first time. This year's winners were selected by artist and educator Emily Casella.

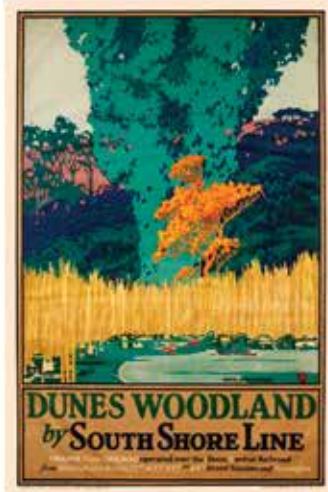

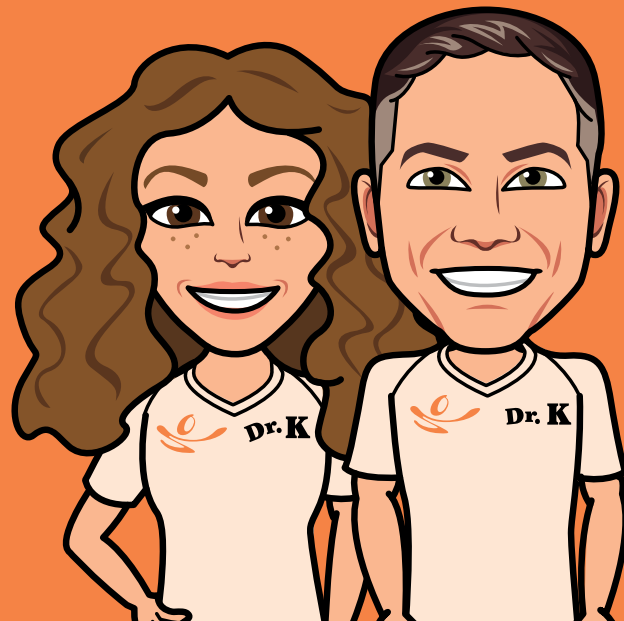

Supporters of the Arts flocked to the Center for Visual & Performing Arts on June 2, 2023, for an evening of fundraising and celebration. The 30th Annual Beaux Arts Ball, "Round Up for the Arts," was a fun-filled, boot-scootin' good time. It was a tremendous success, bringing in over \$204,000 in support of Arts Education in our Region. The western theme was executed with an array of wagon wheels, rustic wood elements, cowboy boots, an array of Western flavored flora and more. Guests embraced the theme with many Gents in boots, cowboy hats, bolos, and ornate matching belt buckles; and ladies stunned in dazzling boots, hats, and western chic dresses.

The Beaux Arts Ball is South Shore Arts' largest fundraising event, with proceeds benefitting the *everykid* art education programs for children, youth, and families. The success of the Ball through the years has allowed South Shore Arts to touch the lives of innumerable residents of our community since the program was created in 1995.

This year's auction featured over two hundred items and was our most successful ever; bidders used a mobile platform and were able to bid right from their phones. 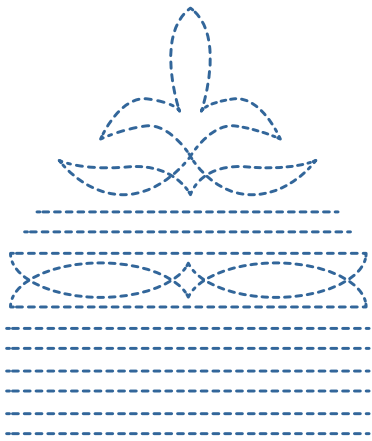

As the Elementary Art Department Chair, she pushed her team with ambitious ideas, such as “Spring into the Arts,” a city-wide celebration of all art forms in the heart of downtown Valpo. Since its 2016 beginnings, the creative output of over 8,000 students has been celebrated and exhibited across over 20 business venues. Providing a public platform for students was the intention of the festival’s inception and has been widely embraced by students, parents, and the community alike.

Prior to teaching elementary art, Jessica ran her own boutique, Jade and Raspberry Designs, catering to graphic, web, and interior design for clients. Later the same business morphed into DIY Art Studio, where she expanded the walls of her classroom by offering online, deliverable, and in-person art lessons when the epidemic demanded a high need.

As Director of Education for South Shore Arts, Jessica looks forward to working closely with staff and instructors to ensure the highest standards of education for classes and workshops. She is excited to expand the *everykid* program, which served 139 classrooms last year across Lake and Porter Counties, engaging 3,500 students in various art and literacy programs.

Jessica currently serves as the first Executive Director of the Valparaiso Creative Council, a nonprofit organization created to champion artistic endeavors throughout the Valparaiso community. She is an alumnus of Indiana University in Bloomington with a bachelor’s degree in fine arts and has her Masters in Education from Calumet College of Saint Joseph.



Laura Camacho is the new Administrative Coordinator for South Shore Arts.

A native of the Northwest Indiana area, she and her husband moved back to Northwest Indiana after living and working in Illinois for the past 28 years. She retired from her previous career as a paralegal after 25 years of working in the legal field. She has a BA in History with a particular love and passion for American history. She is excited to work for South Shore Arts and the Northwest Indiana Symphony and for the opportunity to help promote the arts in the Northwest Indiana region. In her spare time, Laura enjoys reading, yoga, walking, travel, good food and good times with family and friends.

Laura will not only provide administrative support for South Shore Arts, but she will also oversee the organization’s responsibilities as a Regional Arts Partner of the Indiana Arts Commission, providing support to grant applicants during the annual IAC grant cycle, recruiting grant review panelists, and assisting grantees with their annual grant reports. She is also responsible for convening the Regional Arts Council throughout the year and providing promotional opportunities for artists and arts providers in our region, including the Regional Arts Calendar on the South Shore Arts website.



The Teen Arts Board

—providing professional development for emerging young artists

The South Shore Arts Teen Arts Board is composed of a group of exceptionally talented young artists from schools across Lake County, all bound by an interest in pursuing the Arts professionally. The Teens recently completed their largest project of the year: a mural along the stairwell at Substation 9 in Hammond. The mural, which serves as the bookend for the 2022-23 Teen Arts Board year, came into fruition after several TAB members expressed a desire to make something that would be lasting in the community during a meeting last March. They wanted something large and impactful that this year's TAB group could leave behind.

Local muralist Marco Salazar led the Teens through the process of creating the mural from inspiration and design to the execution during weekly meetings that spanned almost two months.

The teen artists ultimately set out to create an ambitious piece of art that played with warm and cool color palettes, light and dark and incorporated natural elements. Perhaps the biggest challenge they had to overcome was the unreachable height of the wall in some places. The finished

piece is stunning—a joyful kaleidoscope of nature organized by color that includes a brilliant yellow sun, fluttering orange butterflies, wild red flames, a swirling purple galaxy, lily pads upon a pond of blue under a starry night, a sturdy tree complimented by reaching vines and upward and back to yellow again with a field of giant sunflowers. TAB member Kayana says, “I enjoyed making the mural, and I love everyone’s part. My personal favorite is the purple one.”

The current Teen Arts Board drew inspiration from the 2019-20 Teen Arts Board, whose members created a traveling Black Lives Matter mural under the guidance of Ish Muhammad.

The Teen Arts Board is free to join and provides essential experiences that aim to support young artists refining their creative processes, building their portfolios, and advancing their resumes, paving the way to a sustainable future in the arts. 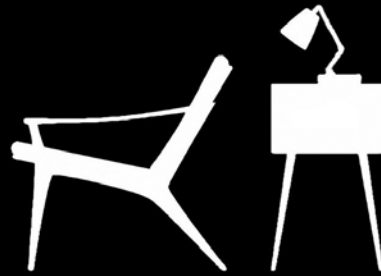
